On behalf of the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE), I am pleased to advise you that the CCNE Board of Commissioners acted at its meeting on September 17-20, 2024, to grant accreditation to the **Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) program** at University of Pittsburgh for 10 years, extending to December 31, 2034. The accreditation action is effective as of February 26, 2024, which is the first day of the program's recent CCNE on-site evaluation. You should plan for the next on-site evaluation to take place in the spring of 2034.

The program was considered by the Board using the *CCNE Standards for Accreditation of Baccalaureate and Graduate Nursing Programs (Standards) (2018)*. However, please note that CCNE revised its *Standards* in 2024, and the *2024 Standards* go into effect on January 1, 2025.

At its meeting, the Board determined that the program substantially complied with all four accreditation standards. The Board additionally determined that there is a compliance concern with respect to Key Element II-E.

A compliance report must be submitted to demonstrate the program's substantial compliance with the following key element:

Demonstrate that faculty are:

- academically prepared for the areas in which they teach; and
- experientially prepared for the areas in which they teach (Key Element II-E in 2018 *Standards* crosswalks to Key Element II-F in 2024 *Standards*).

Specifically, demonstrate that the program coordinator for the adult-gerontology primary care nurse practitioner track is nationally certified in the same population-focused area of practice.

The compliance report must address the 2024 Standards. The deadline for submitting the compliance report to CCNE is December 1, 2025. Please email the report, along with appendices, if any, as a PDF attachment to ccnereports@ccneaccreditation.org.

As is required for all accredited programs, a continuous improvement progress report (CIPR) must be submitted at the midpoint of the accreditation term. The deadline for submitting the CIPR to CCNE is December 1, 2029.

Please note that each aforementioned report needs to demonstrate the program's substantial compliance with the CCNE standards that are in effect at the time of the report's submission. For more information about reports and the report review process, please refer to the CCNE procedures.

As you know, the team report and the program's response to the team report are available to the institution in the CCNE Online Community. We hope that the results of the self-study process and the team report will be useful to the continued growth and development of the nursing program. The certificate of accreditation will be mailed to you in the coming weeks.

In accordance with CCNE policy, if a program or institution elects to make a public disclosure of a program's accreditation status with CCNE, the program or institution must disclose that status accurately. The program or institution disclosing the information must identify the nursing program and its affiliation with CCNE. Please ensure that the institution's website and other materials are updated to reflect this language, as appropriate.

As noted above, CCNE's [Standards for Accreditation for Baccalaureate and Graduate Nursing Programs](https://www.aacnnursing.org/CCNE-Accreditation/Accreditation-Resources/Standards-Procedures-Guidelines) (2024) go into effect on January 1, 2025. All programs are expected to substantially comply with the CCNE standards and procedures that are in effect throughout the period of accreditation. Substantive change notifications must be received by CCNE no earlier than 90 days prior to implementation or occurrence of the change, but no later than 90 days after implementation or occurrence of the change.
