The Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP) is pleased to inform you of its vote on **May 18, 2018** to award **initial accreditation** to the Assistive Technology program at University of Pittsburgh, Pittsburgh, PA. This program is known as the Master of Science program in Rehabilitation Technology at your institution, but it was evaluated using the Standards and Guidelines for the Accreditation of Educational Programs in Assistive Technology.

The recent peer review conducted by the Committee on Accreditation for Rehabilitation Engineering and Assistive Technology Education (CoA-RATE) and CAAHEP's Board of Directors recognizes the program's substantial compliance with the nationally established accreditation Standards. The initial accreditation status will expire on **May 31, 2023**.
