A RESOLUTION

CALLING FOR THE ADOPTION OF OPEN EDUCATIONAL RESOURCES

$1 \\ 2 \\ 3 \\ 4$	WHEREAS,	the cost of college textbooks is often a major affordability issue for students, who take on additional debt to pay for textbooks, or undercut their own learning by forgoing the purchase of textbooks;
$5\\6\\7$	WHEREAS,	The College Board places the annual cost of books and supplies at \$1,250 ¹ with individual books costing upwards of \$300;
8 9 10	WHEREAS,	for the 2017-2018 school year, the Office of Admissions & Financial Aid estimates the cost of textbooks for each student to be \$772 ² ;
$11\\12$	WHEREAS,	rising costs of higher education place an immense financial burden on students, with the average

17 18 19 20 21 22	WHEREAS,	Open Educational Resources (OERs) are defined as: syllabi, lesson plans, lab books, worksheets, video lectures, textbooks, and full courses published under an Open License that allows their reuse and repurposing by others and are freely available for anyone to use online;
23 24 25 26	WHEREAS,	an 'open textbook' is defined as: a textbook written by education professionals and released online under an Open License permitting everyone to freely use, print, share, and adapt the material;
$27 \\ 28$	WHEREAS,	open textbooks offer an affordable, comparable, and flexible alternative to expensive commercial textbooks;
29 30	WHEREAS,	it is the prerogative of faculty members to select the course materials that are most appropriate for a class;
31 32 33 34	WHEREAS,	it is appropriate for faculty members to seek and consider using OERs, including open textbooks, in their courses as long as there is no reduction in educational quality;
35 36 37 38	WHEREAS,	The University of Pittsburgh should do everything in its power to control the cost of higher education and OERs could relieve some of the financial burden facing students; <i>now, therefore, be it</i>
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$40 \\ 41 \\ 42 \\ 43$	RESOLVED,	on this 16th day of January in the year 2018, the University of Pittsburgh Student Government Board supports the expanded use of OERs at Pitt; <i>and be it</i> <i>further</i>

56 57 58 59	RESOLVED,	that the Student Government Board fully supports the federal Affordable College Textbook Act ⁵ , which would allocate federal funding for the expansion of OERs; <i>and be it further</i>
60 61 62 63	RESOLVED,	that members of Student Government Board will work with numerous stakeholders of the University to educate and encourage faculty members to design and implement OERs in their courses; <i>and be it finally</i>
64 65 66	RESOLVED,	this resolution shall be effective immediately upon adoption and shall reflect the official position of the University of Pittsburgh Student Government Board.
