

# University Council on Graduate Study Minutes Tuesday, December 13, 2022 3 p.m. to 5 p.m. Zoom

The minutes from the October 2022 meeting were approved (26 in favor and 1 abstention).

#### **Academic Planning Proposals**

## Proposal to establish a major in Medical Science for the Master of Science degree in the School of Medicine

The School of Medicine proposed to establish a Master of Science in Medical Science through the School of Medicine. The degree will recognize the accomplishments of students who complete the first two years of the MD program but are unable to complete the MD degree for a variety of reasons. This degree will allow them to apply for and be offered more competitive positions with higher salaries, which will allow them to pay off their educational loans more easily.

A motion was made and seconded to recommend to the Provost that the proposal be approved. Members present voted in favor of recommending approval to the Provost (29 in favor and 1 abstention).

## Proposal to modify the K-12 Principal Graduate Certificate in the School of Education

The School of Education proposed to modify the K-12 Principal graduate certificate to increase accessibility by converting the program to online learning with a high level of peer-to-peer interaction, innovative technologies, and asynchronous instruction. These changes include reducing credit hours from 24 credit hours to 18 credits hours. These changes will make the certificate more marketable and attractive to students, in addition to strengthening their partnerships with existing groups both in the University and in the community.

A motion was made and seconded to recommend to the Provost that the proposal be approved. Members present voted in favor of recommending approval to the Provost (27 in favor and 3 abstentions).

Proposal to establish a Critical Instructional Design and Technology Graduate Certificate in the School of Education



The School of Education proposed to establish a graduate certificate in Critical Instructional Design and Technology to create learning opportunities that support critical inquiry around the design and development of pedagogical content for different course delivery formats (online, hybrid, or face-to-face). The certificate will provide opportunities for the course facilitators and students to explore, examine, and discuss historical, contemporary, and emerging instructional design theories and models. Through this program, students will explore, discuss, and apply applications of critical pedagogy to instructional design practices.

A motion was made and seconded to recommend to the Provost that the proposal be approved. Members present voted in favor of recommending approval to the Provost (27 in favor and 3 abstentions).

#### **Announcements**

Vice Provost Godley reviewed the 6 subcommittees that UCGS members will begin working on in January 2023.

#### 1. Graduate Faculty (UCGS only)

This committee will consider the definitions of <u>graduate faculty</u> and adjunct graduate faculty, potential mentor training requirements, conditions under which graduate faculty status can be revoked and the process for appointment to graduate faculty.

#### 2. Guidance on Graduate Mentoring and Advising (UCGS only)

This committee will update the University's guide to graduate mentoring and advising (entitled <u>Elements of Good Academic Advising</u>) and make recommendations for University-wide mentor/advisor training and support.

#### 3. Advanced Standing Credits (with PACUP)

This committee will consider transfer credit maximums and other issues related to transfer credits including block transfers.

**4. Academic Program Structure and Dual Degrees/Majors** (with PACUP) This committee will discuss <u>academic program structures</u> such as <u>ARCOs</u>, <u>dual/joint degrees</u>, stackable programs and how many credits can count for two programs concurrently.

#### **5. Academic Probation/Suspension** (with PACUP)

This committee will consider the criteria by which students are placed on <u>academic probation</u> or suspended/dismissed for academic reasons and the process for each.



6. Course Repeat/G Grade (with PACUP)

This committee will consider regulations regarding <u>G grades</u> (similar to incomplete grades), the conditions under which students can <u>repeat a course</u>, and how repeated courses appear on the student's transcript.
