## **Academic Planning Proposals**

Proposal to establish a PhD major in Africana Studies in the Department of Africana Studies, the Dietrich School of Arts and Sciences.

The Dietrich School of Arts and Sciences, Department of Africana Studies proposed to establish a new PhD major in Africana Studies. This new major will provide an advanced graduate degree that places the experiences, perspectives, agency, and initiative of people of African descent at the center of its focus and provides intellectual frameworks for equipping graduates to produce new scholarship and understandings about those experiences. Moreover, there is strong demand across higher education for scholars and teachers of Black experiences and with the expertise to place those experiences in historical and social context. The major aligns well with the Plan for Pitt, as it will contribute to an inclusive and equitable campus environment that welcomes, values, and embraces diverse perspectives of every member of our community, and creates more preeminent teaching, learning, scholarship, and research experiences.

A motion was made and seconded to recommend to the Provost that the proposal be approved. Members present voted unanimously in favor of recommending approval to the Provost.
