University Counseling Center

Jay Darr presented on the current state of the University Counseling Center (UCC) and highlighted new services that have been implemented since his arrival to Pitt. Dr. Darr was pleased to announce that the UCC has not had a wait list since March of 2019. He attributes the improvement to the reconfiguration of the intake process, newly offered self-help tools, and the addition of counselors who are embedded in residence halls and on-site in some graduate schools. Dr. Darr encouraged Council to familiarize themselves with the services offered by the UCC
